The Eagles have landed in Maple Ridge and Sechelt. The 7 foot tall fiberglass eagle sculpture is part of Eagles in the City, the third chapter in the BC Lions Society's trilogy of public art projects raising funds for the BC Lions Society Easter Seal Services.

In Maple Ridge "Sea to Sky" eagle was painted by local artist Rhonda Laurie, a contributing artist to both Orcas in the City in 2004 and Spirit Bears in the City in 2006 and in Sechelt "In the Eye of the Eagle" was painted by well known hockey legend now artist Richard Brodeur, who also contributed to Spirit Bears in the City in 2006.

Over 100 Eagles will be on the streets of British Columbia from April 2009 to April 2010 and 10 of these eagles, which are sponsored by local Lions and Lioness clubs, will be placed in areas such as Maple Ridge, Sechelt, Gibsons, Nanaimo, Pitt Meadows, Langley, Kelowna, Kamloops and Vancouver.
